Your first question should then be, what are the correct answers? The answers in order spell out "A BAD CAD DAD".

The answer for the extra credit is Imperative; therefore, try not to use the indicative, except when it is required, as with multiple prime contracts.

If you got the extra credit question correct, add that to your correct answers to give you a final score.
